Bruce Tripp - re Milea Estate Vineyard on Rymph road; creating a vineyard on Hollow road. Supportive of boards initiative to regulate clear cutting. They are in compliance with all laws as they are reclaiming farmland for vinyards. The land was old fields as seen on satellite photos. Those trees removed were new grove and are a small portion of the parcel

Jim Brands – opposes the moratorium and opposes the law that would follow. A moratorium is put in effect to stop a calamity. Asks what is the urgency for the moratorium. Also feels the tree harvesting law that will follow is not necessary. We have more forests today than we did in 1900.
