Councilman Werner said Dean and Nancy met with Russ Tompkins and came up with a list of suggestions which the Town Attorney will incorporate into the law. The TA wants to know if we want to go ahead with the project, Councilman Michael said yes. Councilman Werner asked specific questions of Councilpersons Michael and Cunningham. Concerning the insurance issue, we will handle the homeowner as the Building department does, by signing an affidavit, and a commercial operation is a 1-million-dollar coverage. The Board will revisit the issue in January

6. Approve payment of cemetery flags to Town of Washington – Oberly

The Town of Washington requested the Town of Clinton pay them \$90 so a VFW can have placed American flags on the graves of veterans at Upton Lake Cemetery which partly in the Towns of Clinton and Stanford. Many years ago, the Town Board motioned not to provide American flags for veterans in the Schultzville Cemetery. The NYS Association of Towns' attorney said it is possible to do with restrictions and we should pass a local law to authorize this payment. The funds are not in the 2017 or 2018 budgets. The costs will increase as more veterans die. Eliot asks why was it turned down before, Ray said money is the issue; we have five cemeteries in town. Dean said we are not allowed to fund a private entity. Our flags must be given to a nonprofit and they have to use them in a public way on specific holidays. The lawyer recommended to enact a local law for this to be done. Dean said we got a bill for this already. The board questions the bill. Nancy said we should buy the flags.

MM Supervisor Oberly, 2nd Councilman Appolonia to approve the following resolution: BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board approve payment of cemetery flags to Town of Washington at a cost not to exceed \$90. All aye. Motion carried.

7. Discussion of PERMA Worker's Compensation and Employer Liability Agreement – Oberly

We received a new PERMA Workers Comp Agreement which now includes the establishment of a Safety Program with a Safety Coordinator and other members.

MM Supervisor Oberly, 2nd Councilman Michael to approve the following resolution: BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board approve the agreement between PERMA and the town of Clinton dated November 27, 2017 and authorizes the Town Supervisor to sign the contract. All aye. Motion carried.

8. Approve Special meeting to interview candidates

MM Supervisor Oberly, 2nd Councilman Michael to approve the following resolution: BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board approves that a special Meeting be held on December 21, 2017 at 7 PM in the Town Hall to interview candidates for positions in the new year. People will not be penalized if they are away and we will make other arrangements. All aye. Motion carried.

OTHER

Discussion on Community choice aggregation

Sun & Energy Company acts as an independent insurance broker who seeks out the best policy for a customer. In this case, the company collects the electrical usage needs for local governments to get a large volume of usage to get the best lowest price from renewable energy sources. All the residents, businesses, farmers, and governments located in a local government can be automatically included in the lower electrical usage rate. It is estimated that there would be about a10% reduction in the cost on their electric bill. The Town would need to pass a Local Law to Establish a Community Choice Aggregation Program, approve a Memorandum of Understanding and Joinder Agreement, and an Energy Services Coordinator Agreement. At the January 9, 2018 Town Board meeting, we can discuss if there is interest to move forward on this program and have a public presentation and workshop in the later part of January. At this time the Village of Wappinger Falls and Town of Marlborough has signed up. Discussions are under way with City of Poughkeepsie, Town of Poughkeepsie, Town of Wappinger, and Town of Newburgh. It is expected that the program would start in early 2019. I've given you a package with all the information and details available today.

MM Supervisor Oberly, 2^{nd} Councilman Michael to open the meeting to public discussion. All aye. Motion carried.

Cynthia Koch– spoke on the topic of demolition delay of historic buildings, asked the Town to institute a local law for this issue. She discussed our local law as it relates to historic buildings. The master plan states that saving historic buildings is a priority for the town. We currently have very little landmark protection of our historic buildings. She is proposing this law which will allow us to take a breath and consider tearing down an historic building before we demolish it. She distributed a sample law to board members.

Russ Tompkins – commented on the tree law, in favor of the process to streamline the document and entertaining his input. Feels the previous comments interfere with private property owner rights.

Cynthia Koch – clarified her comments, she is asking for a process that would be considerate saving buildings.

MM Supervisor Oberly, 2nd Councilman Appolonia to close the meeting to public discussion and return to the regular order of business. All aye. Motion carried.

Mike Appolonia comment: Mike looked back 40 years to when he first started his public service. What impressed him was his mail, all of which referred to him as Honorable Appolonia. The honor is a trust and he recognized that people are depending on you to have principle in decision-making; hopes he succeeded. We live in a wonderful and great town its given so much, so hopefully we can give back. It has been a pleasure working with the board and we welcome Michael Whitton, we will give him all the support he needs to do the job.
