Water, Watersheds and Wetlands: No new information.

Biodiversity: The CAC would like to communicate with Omega about erosion issues around Long Pond.

Education and Outreach: Barbara has made available on the town's website the 2016 Omega Institute Neighbors Program Application. This enables Town of Clinton residents access to the Institute's grounds and facilities such as the library, sanctuary, trails, tennis courts, beach and lake once the application has been approved. Town residents must sign in with guest services before entering the grounds.

Dean would like to develop an information exchange based on the Town website.

Nature Trail Subcommittee: Members will paint the trail markers in the spring to make them more visible.

Zoning Revision: Dean reported on the work of the committee on tree protection in the new zoning law. Discussion followed about the concern of the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation about erosion caused by clearcutting. Dean discussed downed treed along streams and floodplains.

Proposed Powerlines: No new information.

Old Business: There was a discussion about the demolition of the old dam in Hibernia. The NYS DEC hopes to meet an August deadline.
