RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING ENERGY BENCHMARKING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN MUNICIPAL BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, buildings are the single largest user of energy in the State of New York. The poorest performing buildings typically use several times the energy of the highest performing buildings—for the exact same building use; and

WHEREAS, collecting, reporting, and sharing building energy data on a regular basis allows municipal officials and the public to understand the energy performance of municipal buildings relative to similar buildings nationwide, and equipped with this information the Town of Clinton (hereinafter “Town”) is able to make smarter, more cost-effective operational and capital investment decisions, reward efficiency, and drive widespread, continuous improvement; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Clinton Town Board (hereinafter “Town Board”) desires to use Building Energy Benchmarking - a process of measuring a building’s energy use, tracking that use over time, and comparing performance to similar buildings - to promote the public health, safety, and welfare by making available good, actionable information on municipal building energy use to help identify opportunities to cut costs and reduce pollution in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board desires to establish procedure or guideline for Town of Clinton staff to conduct such Building Energy Benchmarking; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board adopts the “Building Energy Benchmarking Policy/Procedures” annexed hereto and made a part hereof as Schedule “A”.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairperson of the Conservation Advisory Committee (CAC) is authorized to advise the Town Board on all actions necessary to appropriately implement the provisions of this Resolution.
