Jeff Domanski: But also reflecting on the other, aggregations that jewel is doing around the state just for some contextual understanding about the amount of work that's been happening, which is very

exciting.

Jeff Domanski: And, by becoming a subscriber with no fees there's no there's no hidden costs associated with this you just subscribed and, in return, you end up for these participants.

Jeff Domanski: With a 10% saving off of your entire electricity bill, which is a monetary credit and it's based on the portion assigned to you.

Jeff Domanski: So it's a separate arrangement from the electricity supply portion, it is a second way to contribute to putting more renewables on the New York state grid.

Jeff Domanski: With a separate financial transaction the electricity supply is a line item change of the supply section of your central Hudson bill.

Jeff Domanski: The Community solar credit comes after that, in the in the Ad in the charges and adjustments section so it's a.

Jeff Domanski: Reduction a deduction that happens if you are a subscriber to Community solar and that was an opt in program for for Community members.

Jeff Domanski: The exciting news that's happened is that this is transitioning now per State mandate on the utility companies were what we have spoken about where, if you had been a Community solar subscriber you had to deal with a second bill.

Jeff Domanski: A bill that was always 90% of the credit you got on your utility bill such that you ended with a 10% savings.

Jeff Domanski: And because of the predominance of the Community members that stayed in the default option for all 10 communities have a 100% renewable electricity supply.

Jeff Domanski: More than 200,000 greenhouse tons of greenhouse gas emissions related.

Jeff Domanski: So very significant impacts and then the double Asterix indicate that, in the reporting that was done by the supplier We selected that was hydro power from New York state.

Jeff Domanski: Which is a mix that will change as the programs go forward, there are solar and wind power projects that are in development that will feed CCA program so that it won't just be hydro power in the years ahead.

Jeff Domanski: The pandemic did have an impact, unfortunately, on the on the cost benefits of our Program.

Jeff Domanski: Are estimate for the part of the program participants was about a \$5 and 50 cent per household per month, so each household for a monthly basis paid that \$5 and 50 cents more.

Jeff Domanski: For the 100% renewable product versus what they would have paid if they stayed with central Hudson for the non renewable rate.

Jeff Domanski: So there was an impact, but a relatively minor impact and, but that is important to note that that is in terms of sourcing and apples to oranges comparison.

private product.

Jeff Domanski: There was extensive engagement with the customers there's a lot of moving parts and I apologize there's a lot i'm throwing at you tonight.
