January 17, 2023 PB Meeting

Glazer Non-Hosted Short-Term Rentals - 20-22 Bel Air, Tax Grid No. 6469-00-539562.

Applicant seeks Special Permit to do Non-Hosted Short-Term Rental pursuant to Sec. 250-69-1 of the zoning law.

- Applicant was back with his legal counsel for the conclusion of his application.
- It was noted that public hearings were held in July and November, 2022.
- Public hearing was closed in November 15, 2022.
- The board had a lengthy discussion on how to mitigate the neighbor's strong concerns and opposition regarding the private drive.

Requested Non-Hosted STR for 6 lodgers and 0 visitors were granted, With 4 Ayes and 3 Nays Vote.

Smithyman Non-Hosted STR Renewal – 5 Lake Drive, Tax Grid No. 6368-00-752443

Applicant seeks Special Permit Renewal to do Non-Hosted Short-Term Rental pursuant to Sec. 250-69-1 of the zoning law.

- Requested special permit was renewed.

Upton Lake School (Discussion) – Salt Point Turnpike, Tax Grid No. 6566-02-587843 & 648951

Upton Lake wishes to build a new high school that will be connected to an existing elementary school.

It was noted that Upton Lake Christian School is seeking site plan approval from the Town of Washington Planning Board to construct a replacement facility for an existing private high school located at 20 Shepherd's Way with parcel number 6566-00-648951. The current application proposes a new two-story, approximately 14,000 square foot building to be attached to the northeast corner

of the main building. The expansion of the school is on Town of Washington parcel and the Town of Clinton provides access to the property off Salt Point Turnpike.

- The board had a lengthy discussion about concern on the road impact given the proposed increase in the number of the students.
- The board exchanged comments about the proposal and agreed to consent the Town of Washington as lead agency for SEQRA purposes.
- Mr. Bonanno to attend the Town of Washington Planning Board meeting.

Applicant seeks Special Permit to do Non-Hosted Short-Term Rental pursuant to Sec. 250-69-1 of the zoning law.

- The applicant wishes to do short-term rental on this 3-bedroom house

RR Orchard Holdings LLC Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Plan -(Conclusion) property located at 1347 Hollow Road, Tax Grid No. 6566-00-005670.

Applicant seeks soil erosion and sediment control plan for the purpose of constructing a single-family dwelling pursuant to Sec. 250.71 of the Town of Clinton Zoning Regulations.

- This is a 22-acre lot in the AR5 Zoning District.
- Applicant proposes to construct a house, pool and pool house on this property.
- The board discussed and reviewed the comments from the town engineer.
- Applicant addressed the town engineer's comments as indicated on the latest site plan.
- The board had a lengthy discussion about the procedural process in timeline, permits, and site pre-inspection by the town engineer to ensure soil erosion measures and mitigation.
- Short Form was reviewed and negative declaration was issued.
