What is CCA?



Community Choice Aggregation (CCA) is:

A **policy** enabling **municipalities** to source energy on behalf of its residents and businesses.

Enabled in New York State in 2016

Why? "Public Benefit" win-win-win:

- 1) Save money
- 2) Clean Energy
- 3) Consumer Protection



- Largest clean energy buy in NYS history
- 24 of 27 towns 100% clean default

Hudson Valley Community Power Rates

Hudson Valley Community Power has secured rates for your electricity supply that are lower than the historic, average Central Hudson supply rates by organizing a competitive bidding process among energy supply companies (ESCOs).

- Direct Energy will be your new supplier, beginning on your first meter-read date after June 1, 2020.
- The new rate will remain fixed for a 13-month period through lune 2021.



Program Rate Choices



Supply Options

There are two fixed-rate electricity supply options under our program:

(1) 100% Renewable and (2) Standard. You may choose between these supply options, or opt out of the program. The Town of Clinton has chosen the 100% Renewable Option as the default. You will automatically be enrolled in the 100% Renewable option unless you choose the Standard option or opt-out of the program.

- 100% Renewable Option: 100% of your electricity supply is matched by Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs) provided by New York State renewable power plants (hydropower, wind, solar).
- Standard Option: Your electricity supply is a mixture of fossil fuels, nuclear, and some renewable energy.

Common Questions



- Does this replace my utility company?
 - No. All through utility bill (line item change).*
- Why are you doing this? How can you do this?
 - Public benefit for the 3 goals (above).
- Will this save me money?
 - 5-10% on Supply price, not guaranteed.
- Am I locked into this for 2 years?
 - No. Can exit freely at any time.
- What happens after 2 years? Will the rate go crazy?
 - No contract ends, back to utility. Can repeat.
- Where does the energy come from?
 - Renewable electricity from New York State.
 - *Community Solar local + <u>quaranteed</u> ~10% savings
- Does this work with my existing solar system?
 - CCA yes. Community Solar No





Community Solar: how it works



- 1. You subscribe to a share of a solar farms.
- 2. The solar farm feeds clean power into the grid while earning you energy credits.
- 3. You purchase these energy credits at a discount, reducing your electricity costs by ~10%.

Note: You <u>cannot</u> subscribe to Community Solar if you have a solar PV system at the service address.


