Minutes – January 8, 2020

Minutes: The motion to approve the minutes was made by Maya Goer-Palenzuela. It was seconded by Marian Thompson. The December 11, 2019 minutes were approved by the group.

Finances: 2020 Budget: Amount: \$500 Spent: \$0 Remaining: \$500

Sustainability Fund – We invited Charlotte Binns of Joule Assets speak about the Sustainability Fund as it relates to Community Solar. Joule Community Power has established a community solar program that gives back to the community and enables subscribers who support clean energy generation. Subscribers can save approximately 10% annually on electricity by supporting renewable energy. To encourage communities such as Clinton to move closer to using 100% renewal energy, \$50 will be put in a sustainability fund in Clinton for each subscriber that enrolls in Community Solar. The funds can be used to fund sustainability projects of our choosing.

Community Choice Aggregation – Via email, Jeff Domanski, Hudson Valley Energy, wrote that a second CCA package was submitted with new documentation to the Department of Public Service. The submission was accepted and was awaiting approval.

Climate Smart Program Webpage – Members reviewed Merida Welles’ webpage before the meeting. They had very positive feedback. It was suggested that the page be rearranged to place the reasons why our residents need to be encouraged to reduce emissions followed by what they can do to accomplish it.

Kirchman/Wiedman Property – A letter was sent to the Planning Board expressing our concerns about the deer fencing listed in the December 11, 2019 minutes.
